<b>Stage 1</b>	Begin researching your topic.	Decide on your methodology.		
<b>Stage 2</b>	Continue researching and making notes (with traceable references!).	Put this methodology into action; submit any relevant ethics forms.		
<b>Stage 3</b>	Continue researching, note-taking with clear referencing.	Design necessary forms/questions etc., reach out to respondents.		
<b>Stage 4</b>	Begin to draw your research to a close — collect and collate.	Gather your data.		
<b>Stage 5</b>		Collate and begin to transcribe/analyse etc.	Begin drafting an introduction, referring to your notes.	
<b>Stage 6</b>		Continue with analysis.	Drawing heavily on notes, write up the literature review.	
<b>Stage 7</b>		Finalise analysis.		
<b>Stage 8</b>			Write up methodology.	
<b>Stage 9</b>			Write findings, discussion and conclusion, drawing on both the literature review and analysis.	
<b>Stage 10</b>				Read over and redraft where necessary.
<b>Stage 11</b>			Write abstract.	
<b>Stage 12</b>				Proofread and edit the entire document.
<b>End Stage</b>				Submit and relax!
